## **About the Program**

We are delighted to inform you that Kansai University of International Studies (KUISs) will offer a new international collaborative education program in March 2024 as a part of our second Inter-University Exchange Project. The core topics of our programs will be the construction of safe and secure social infrastructure through tourism, hospitality, disaster and crime prevention.

In our "Kobe Program March 2024 - Safety & Hospitality Management and Japanese Culture" program, students from the U.S., Canada, Malaysia and KUISs in Japan learn the current hospitality and tourism industry in Japan through classes and field studies. They gain insights into Japanese hospitality, cultural attractions, and its challenges.

In the fields of tourism and hospitality, we are facing a shortage of human resources and the need for more sophisticated and digitalized operations. This program aims to foster students with entrepreneurial mindsets, the ability to adapt to different cultures, and flexible thinking skills that are required for a rapidly changing society.

## Study in Kobe, Japan

This program is hosted by KUISs, located in Kobe City, Hyogo Prefecture. Kobe opened as Japan's first international trading port in 1868 and has since developed into an international city with a unique blend of traditional and modern elements. With excellent accessibility to other major cities such as Kyoto, Osaka, and Nara, students can explore the Japanese countryside as well within Hyogo Prefecture, which is rich in history and tourist sites.

#### Costs

#### Transportation:

KUISs will book and cover the full or partial cost of flights to Japan for participating students and one (1) faculty member. (\*) The local transportation fees (including transportation between the airport and Sannomiya)

and the cost of activities (e.g. entrance ticket to USJ) should be fully paid by the participating students and faculty members.

#### Accommodation:

KUISs will book clean, safe, and affordable accommodation in a convenient location. The cost of the accommodation should be fully paid by the students and staff members.

\*The students and staff members may have to cover some cost in some cases.

#### Scholarship

The qualified students will receive JASSO scholarship funding (\*\*). JASSO is a Japanese government agency, which provides various scholarship programs.

#### JASSO scholarship:

Short Term (10 days) : 80,000JPY per student Mid / Long term: 80,000JPY per month, per student from the fiscal year 2024.

80,000JPY will be provided in cash. Students can use this to cover the partial cost of their transportation, accommodation, and food during their stay in Japan.
