ACP Off-campus Program was held at Kansai University International Studies



An off-campus program entitled, “The Japanese Safety Management and Japanese Culture” was held at Kansai University of International Studies (KUIS) from Sunday, March 4 to Tuesday, March 13, 2018, where 19 students from six ACP consortium-member universities in four countries participated. The participating students learned about the damage caused by the Great Hanshin-Awaji Earthquake and preparedness for earthquake disasters through lectures and fieldwork. On the last day of the program, a presentation session was held in which participants reported their study results. In regard to their impressions of disaster prevention policies in Japan they said, “Elementary school education in Japan seems progressive as disaster education and disaster prevention programs are incorporated.”


