

## ACP Online International Symposium

“How has COVID-19 impacted society? How will our society be changed?” was held



26 million people were infected by the coronavirus disease (COVID-19) worldwide, killing more than 800 thousand people. Each country made great efforts to avoid the spread of the COVID-19, including lock down of towns, closing shops and business. Our everyday life has completely changed, and when we look at the education, universities are in difficulties with limited learning opportunities at classes and local communities, besides, all of the overseas programs are cancelled. Thus, students tend to become isolated.

Under these circumstances, Kansai University of International Studies (KUIS) together with Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM) organized “Asian Cooperative Program (ACP) Online International Symposium.”

The symposium was held utilizing the know-how of distance education system to bring together students from different countries in various situations. The number of participated faculty members, staffs and students through ZOOM system reached over 70 from UUM, Universitas Gadjah Mada (UGM), Universitas Atma Jaya Yogyakarta (UAJY), Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman (UTAR), Universitas Lampung (UNILA), and KUIS.

In addition to ZOOM system, the symposium was also live streamed through UUM Face Book and the number of its registered viewer reached 250, from UAJY, UNILA, Management and Science University (MSU), Islamic University of Raden Intan Lampung, University of Tsukuba and so on.

The symposium was started by an opening speech of Dr. Atsushi HAMANA, the president of KUIS, ACP Chairperson. Dr. HAMANA’s opening speech was followed by “Report of COVID-19 Impact and Future of Higher Education” from four Specialists represented UUM, UGM, UAJY and KUIS.

Next, “Special Report: How Kobe City is corresponding to the COVID-19 crisis and its future strategy” was made by Mr. Masumi Taniguchi, Director General, Planning and Coordination Bureau, Kobe City Government. Kobe is the city where one of KUIS’s campuses, Kobeyamate Campus, is located.

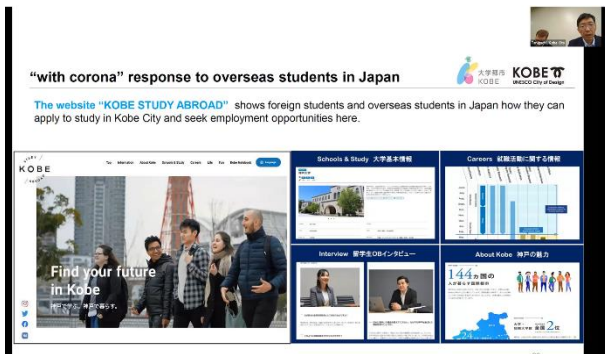

At Questions and Answer Section, lots of questions were raised by participated faculty members such as “How do your university’s

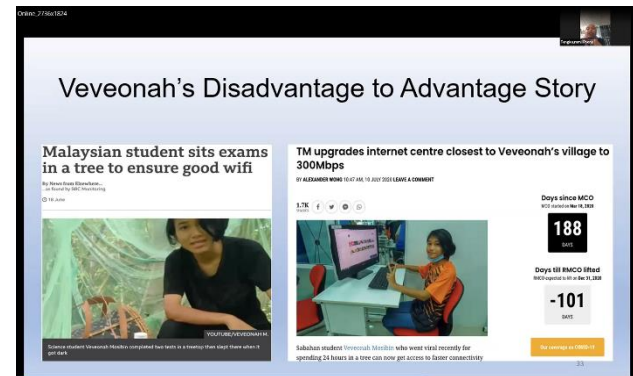
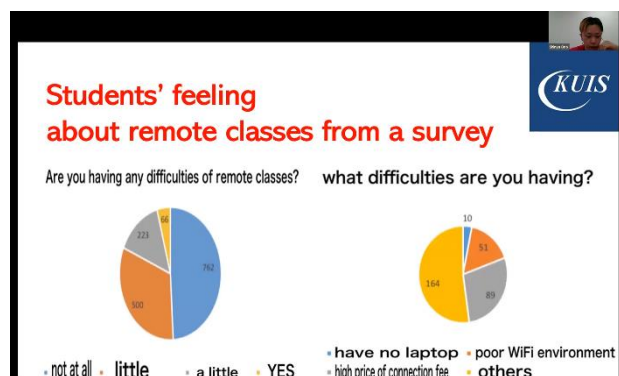
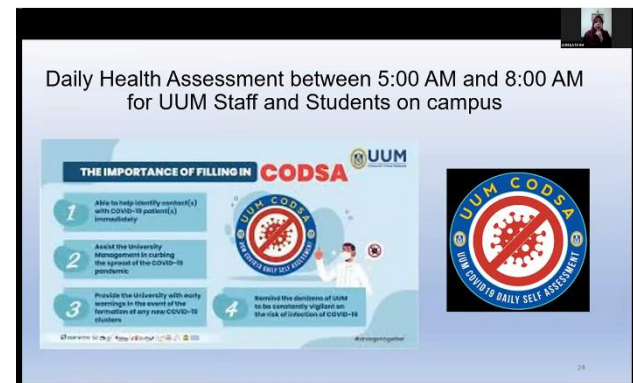
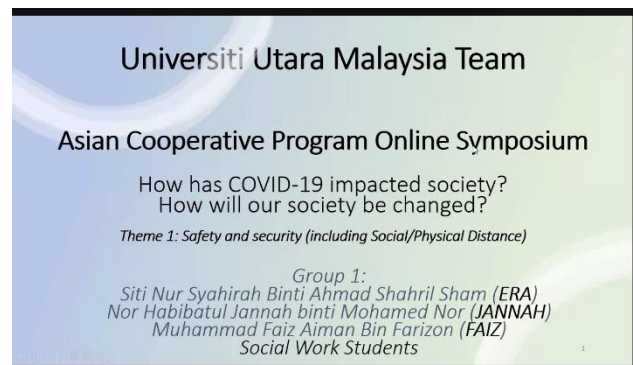




