



Our mission is to spread the spirit of "I AI I EN" throughout the world and to nurture human resources who can play an active role in the Asia-Pacific region in the future.





Message from the President

Against this background, at all its schools, KUISs deepens students' knowledge and education from the perspectives of globalization, safety and management. Furthermore, through diverse on-site experiences on various sites, students are nurtured as people who can manage a safe and secure society.

The university has restructured its undergraduate departments across its three campuses - Kobe Yamate, Amagasaki, and Miki - to provide a regionally-focused education that leverages the unique attributes of each location. The Kobe Yamate Campus, situated in a culturally diverse area, offers a liberal arts education with a focus on safety and tourism. The Amagasaki Campus, adjacent to the Osaka metropolitan area, provides teacher training, management/marketing, business design education, and disaster prevention, and also maintains a day care center. The Miki Campus, located near the Miki Disaster Prevention Park and the Kita-Harima Medical Center, focuses on health and sports education. The university, which now comprises 6 schools, 7 departments, and 18 majors, encourages active learning through team activities, global studies, and community studies. The goal is to foster "Active Persons" who are eager to be proactive and self-directed learners.



At the time of admission

At admission, we conduct an academic ability diagnostic test to place you in a class at the appropriate language level under the guidance of an advisor.

Safety Management Education at KUISs

KUISs prioritizes safety management education, responding to the global rise in natural disasters. We require safety management courses across all departments, equipping students with disaster prevention and emergency response skills. Additionally, we offer a Disaster Management Instructor course and collaborate with Asian entities to enhance specialized knowledge.

ACP (Asian Cooperative Program)

Our university has launched the Asian Cooperative Program (ACP) in response to the increasing global occurrence of natural disasters. The ACP aims to build a global network with Southeast Asian universities to meet the global need for safety and security, and to train individuals who can contribute to Asia's safe development.

Inter-University Exchange Project

It's time to take the leap. Embark on your entrepreneurial journey.

The Inter-University Exchange Project is an initiative for educational exchange sponsored by the Japanese government. Kansai University of International Studies (KUISs) has been selected two years in a row (FY2022 and FY2023). Each grant is used for dynamic and active educational exchanges for a period of five years.

- The FY2022 Project was launched in the fall of 2022 and has been offering active collaborative learning, focusing on global entrepreneurship. Students from five countries, Australia, UK, Canada, India and Japan, have engaged startup projects in Japan and Australia. A short term project in Kobe offers a rich experience to participants and the students perform remarkable final pitches at a Global Student Entrepreneurship Conference.
- 2) The FY2023 Project offers fruitful learning opportunities for students from US, Canada, Malaysia and Japan, using both online and face to face collaboration which is known as the COIL (Collaborative Online International Learning) method. The academic focus of the FY2023 project is A) hospitality management and B) safety management (natural disaster prevention and crime prevention).

Through collaboration between industries, government, and academia, including university networks, this program aims to nurture students with entrepreneurial mindsets, the ability to adapt to different cultures, and critical thinking skills that are required for a rapidly changing society.

📕 Roadmap

Before studying in Japan, you will need to prepare thoroughly. First, you need to secure a student visa, which requires an acceptance letter from us. Next, you should familiarize yourself with the Japanese language and culture to make your transition smoother. It's also important to arrange accommodation before you arrive, whether that's a dormitory, homestay, or private apartment.

Additionally, you should budget for living expenses, tuition fees, and other costs. Lastly, it's recommended to get health insurance that covers you in Japan.

Let's look at the preparations required for studying in Japan.



Admission Requirements

To be considered for admission to KUISs, you must meet our general admission requirements and degree-specific requirements, and demonstrate Japanese language competency. Your degree-specific requirements depend on where you went to high school and which KUISs campus you plan to attend.

How to Apply

You are asked to complete an admission form with your passport name in Japanese, attach a recent photo, and write your name and date of birth on the back of the photo. You must also submit your high school graduation certificate, including any grade skipping or early graduation details. If you skipped a grade or graduated early, provide a document explaining why. Lastly, submit a copy of your Japanese language proficiency certificate or test result, and provide proof of the translator from your current school.

How KUISs Makes Admissions Decisions

We will conduct a document review and interview, and determine the result based on a comprehensive evaluation. KUISs' admission process is competitive and comparative. No matter what degree you apply for, KUISs will broadly evaluate your academic history.

Selection method

Following the review of documents, applicants will undergo an academic proficiency test and interview. The final decision on acceptance will be determined based on an overall assessment.


KUISs considers personal experiences beyond academics. It is a chance for applicants to tell the university what they are most proud of and what they have learnt from their experiences. Personal profile questions require short written responses of 50 to 200 words.
