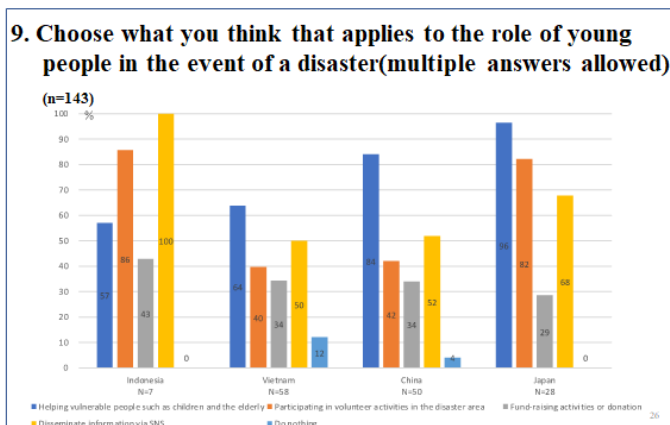

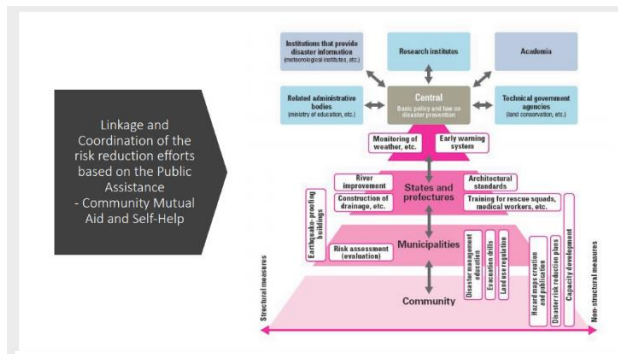
One group each from UGM and UUM and two groups from KUISs participated in the symposium. A total of six evaluators, two from each university, evaluated the presentations using a presentation rubric, resulting in a tie between the UUM and UGM groups for first place.

In addition to the three universities, about 50 students and faculty members from ACP Consortium member universities such as University of the Philippines Diliman, University of the Philippines Cebu, University of Yangon, Universiti Tunku Abdul Rahman, and University of Lampung participated via zoom, and about 500 people watched the live broadcast on Facebook.

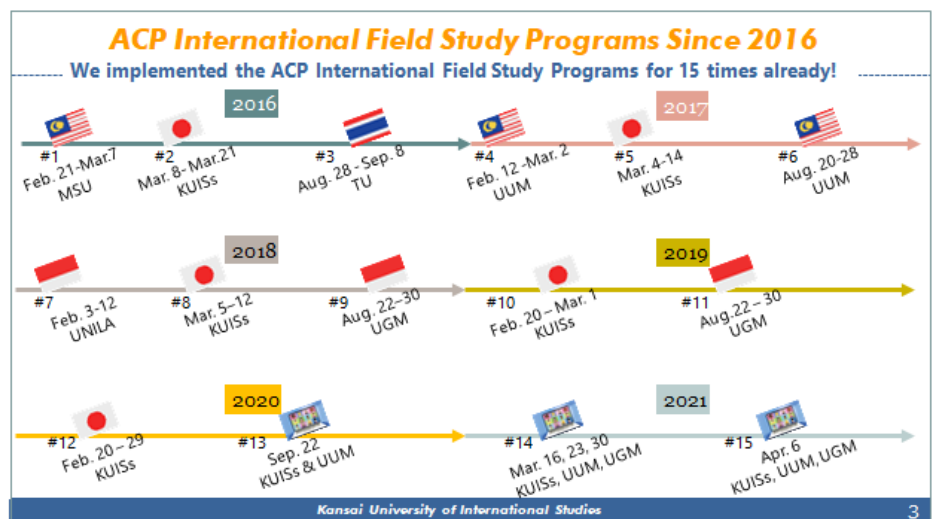

The ACP Consortium has already conducted a total of 15 fieldwork and online symposiums in various locations (Malaysia, Indonesia, Thailand, and Japan) since 2016, and this online symposium is the 16th student program.

In the future, when it becomes possible to come and go between countries, we plan to implement an effective ACP student program that combines field research and online learning.



The 10th ACP Conference was held

The 3rd ACP International Symposium was followed by the 10th ACP Conference. At the beginning of the meeting, ACP Chair, Dr. Hamana, President of Kansai University of International Studies, presented awards to the best presentation groups at the International Symposium. Dr. Hamana then spoke about the future development of ACP activities “with the COVID-19 crisis, the definition of university is changing. Universities and students have made great strides in distance learning literacy. The question is how to utilize and develop this. There is a growing need for measures tailored to students’ backgrounds, characteristics, and challenges.”

What will change from pre-Corona education?

Will the definition of university change?

- "Face-to-face" class lessons are no longer are requirement
 - ➔ High flex, Hybrid
- The line between school and correspondence becomes vague
 - ➔ Distance lessons
- How to incorporate interactivity and collaboration in distance lessons becomes an issue
 - ➔ Experiential learning by utilizing improved distance learning methods as "hands-on"

In the learning process it is required that students can feel "knowledge, skill, attitude have been acquired".

Expansion of Methods

- Remote Tools (Zoom)
 - Preparatory Learning for the Program
 - Working Group Meeting
 - Subject exchange and credit recognition using online system
- Hybrid Method (face-to-face and remote)
 - Research meeting (face-to-face or remote)
- Face to Face Programs
 - ACP International Field Study

Expansion of Program

- Incorporate various methods to deepen learning

Afterwards, representatives from each of the universities participating in the conference commented on the current status of their respective universities and their expectations for the ACP in the future.

Next, KUISs, the chair university, called for the ACP member universities to conduct a joint study in addition to the ACP International Field Study conducted thus far. The research areas are Disaster Risk Reduction / Crime Prevention, COVID-19, Food Security, Well-being etc. Each university will prepare a report on its research area. The representative university will compile them into one report and submit it to an academic journal. At the same time, each university will work to obtain funding for joint research from public research funding agencies in their respective countries. Discussions on joint research will be held in the future. ACP is expected to make great strides in the academic field.

Purpose of Research Project

- ▶ Conduct joint research project on "Safety Management" making use of 16 university networks of ACP consortium
- ▶ International joint research is highly evaluated in university assessment, and it also contributes to individual researchers' evaluation.
- ▶ ACP universities are regularly conducting International Field Studies (IFS) for student. Research projects can be linked to IFSs.

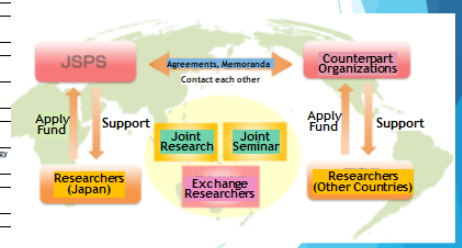
